The DAISY Award For Extraordinary Nurses

<u>Purpose</u>: The DAISY Award is designed to recognize a nurse's compassionate care and clinical skills that exemplifies the kind of nurse that our patients, their families, and our staff recognize as an outstanding role model.

<u>Instructions</u>: Please complete nomination on a separate form including <u>sharing a story</u> as to how your nominee demonstrates the following criteria.

- Serves as a role model for the CARE values:
- Serves as a role model for the nursing profession;
- Is an exceptional team player;
- Established an extraordinary professional connection with patients and families;
- Uses critical thinking skills in the delivery of extraordinary care;
- Demonstrates professionalism in the work environment;
- Is a colleague in good standing;
- Demonstrates respect and excellent interpersonal skills with peers, physicians, and co-workers.

Examples of "nursing excellence" include, but are not limited to the following:

Interdisciplinary Relationships - Heart

- Creates an environment for others to learn;
- Functions as an integral member of the team;
- Develops key relationships with others including the patient and family;
- Advocates for patient/family.

Technical Skills – Hands

- Excellent clinical skills;
- Provision of safe, effective care;
- Commitment to the highest standards of nursing.

Critical Thinking Skills – *Minds*

- Excellent critical thinking and decision-making skills;
- Consistent focus on meeting patient and family goals;
- Commitment to profession of nursing through involvement in local, state, or national organizations.
